## LINER NOTES

by Gordon Au

Jazz has always been an experimenter's artform. But this case has been more explicit than most—namely: if you start with a group of 9 musicians, take away the music venue, take away the audience, take away the ability of musicians to even be in the same room, and their ability to react to each other in real time, then what are you left with? Can music still be made?

With this EP, we hope you'll agree that the answer is YES, though the new form of that music-making takes some getting used to. This was a do-it-yourself learning curve from start to finish: everyone recording themselves with their own equipment, in their own homes, listening to tracks of previous musicians through headphones. The first musician, of course,

played absolutely solo—the musical equivalent of acting a movie scene with yet-to-be-added CG characters. The second musician could hear the first; the third could hear the first two; and so on. There was an aspect of the game of telephone here (maybe a conference call version), with the first and last musicians having quite different experiences. Subsequently came the additional challenge for myself: how to match and smoothly assemble 9 recordings from 9 different microphones in 9 different rooms. In the end, we hope this experimental recording reflects the spirit of the Grand St. Stompers, albeit through the refracting lens of this time of isolation.

But on to the music: These are original compositions we have written and performed in the last few years. It is part of our vision to play originals written in classic styles, as well as to re-interpret old songs in new ways; in addition to faithful re-creations, we believe this is essential to keeping the art form alive and breathing! Here, the bookenders PST and EST are a pair, reflecting two time zones in which I've lived, written around the same time (but 3 hours apart). The Eastern counterpart is significantly faster—draw from that what conclusions you will. Bad Cat Rag, meanwhile, is in honor of a passed-on family member, of the furry sort.

To have these songs reach you, dear listeners, hopefully safely secreted away in your own shelters, is the rest of the experiment I mentioned: with so many of our physical connections, so many aspects of social links sundered, can we still somehow transmit and share our joy, our nostalgia, our sadness, with you?—does music still work?

You will have to answer that for us. Here is sending you health and happiness. We miss you dearly, and look forward to the day we can again make music for you in person. Until then, we hope you listen along and SWING IN PLACE.
